The Museum of Art & Photography (MAP) is one of India's first major museums of South Asian visual culture. The museum is housed in a state-of-the-art, 44,000 square foot building, designed by the acclaimed Indian architectural practice Matthew & Ghosh, on a landmark site at the heart of Bengaluru's museum district. MAP's five-story building on Kasturba Road includes multiple galleries where the collection is displayed, an auditorium, an art and research library, an education centre, a specialised research and conservation facility, as well as a café.

MAP's collection includes more than 1000,000 works predominantly from South Asian: Modern and contemporary art, living traditions, textiles, craft and design, pop culture, pre modern art and photography, dating from the tenth century to contemporary times.

Our mission is to harness the transformative potential of art, to enrich lives, ignite creativity, and connect people. We make art accessible and engaging for everyone through innovative experiences, meaningful dialogue and building communities.

With a focus on accessibility for people with disabilities, and technological tools to make the museum relevant and exciting, MAP ensures a holistic experience for visitors of all ages.

Having launched online in December 2020, at the height of the pandemic, as India's only digital-first museum, and then physically in February 2023, MAP has been bringing its collection to life through multiple pathways, from online exhibitions to a range of articles and essays, collaborations with museums around the world, engaging talks by leading industry figures, and educational resources for kids and adults.

Position Summary

MAP is seeking two enthusiastic and tech-savvy interns to support a special two-month Artificial Intelligence (AI) integration project within our team. This unique opportunity offers interns the chance to explore cutting-edge AI tools, understand operational workflows, and implement practical, productivity-enhancing solutions.

The interns will work closely with staff members across departments to understand routine tasks and then recommend and set up suitable AI-based tools (under \$25/month) to automate or optimise those processes. The final goal is to simplify daily work and create timesaving workflows that frees teams to create engaging experiences for visitors. This position is ideal for individuals interested in applied AI, process design, and digital innovation in the cultural sector.

Key Responsibilities:

- Work alongside various operational teams to map out their daily workflows and identify repetitive or manual tasks, analytical workflows or design task.
- Conduct research on AI tools (subscriptions under \$25/month) suitable for these operational needs.
- Set up selected AI tools using a common user account for ease of management and access.
- Collaborate with team members to design and implement AI-assisted workflows that dramatically improve creativity, speed, efficiency and productivity.
- Provide simple training or documentation to help staff adopt and confidently use the tools.
- Monitor tool performance and provide feedback or adjustments as required.

Desired Skills & Qualifications:

- Strong interest in Artificial Intelligence, digital tools, or process automation.
- Prior experience with AI tools (e.g., chatbots, automation platforms, transcription, scheduling assistants) is a plus.
- Ability to understand user needs and translate them into functional AI tool setups.
- Comfortable using and evaluating different SaaS (Software as a Service) platforms.
- Good communication skills and a collaborative mindset.
- Ability to work independently and manage time across multiple tasks.
