About Museum in A Box (MiB)

This Museum in a Box is a series of boxes, each containing art replicas and learning aides around an overarching theme. Each box is unpacked over multiple workshops that explore various disciplinary lenses. The project also aims to provide those children who cannot access museums, an equal opportunity to benefit from arts-centred and arts-integrated learning.

The programme is developed for **12-13-year-olds** and is mapped to the **6th grade CBSE curriculum**.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Facilitate sessions with school groups, as per a calendar/routine pre-decided between the MIB core team, partner schools and facilitator.
- Take full responsibility of the allocated box, box movement and return to MAP.
- Keep a regular check on box maintenance, and report any wear-and-tear concerns to the MIB core team during check-ins.
- Attend all in-person check-ins arranged by the core team at the museum.

Deliverables:

- Completing a total of 36 deliveries during the course of the engagement.
- Completing a minimum of 2 hours per delivery (excluding commute to school site).
- Must arrange for transportation to and from MAP (during training) and to and from schools with the box (during dissemination). The latter expense would be reimbursed by MAP against actuals.
- Must submit a project report at the end of the engagement period.

Desirable Qualities:

- Excellent communication and facilitation skills.
- Experience of working with young people.
- Punctual, organised and able to work within a team with minimal supervision.
- Self-motivated, with a willingness to learn and ability to effectively collaborate with stakeholders, and adapt as needed.
